

Some Unix - DOS equivalences

UNIX	DOS	Description
<code>cd name</code>	<code>cd name</code>	Change to subdirectory <i>name</i>
<code>Pwd</code>	<code>cd</code> (with no arguments)	Current working directory
<code>Ls</code>	<code>dir /w</code>	Abbreviated List files on directory
<code>ls -l</code>	<code>dir</code>	Detailed list of files on directory
<code>ls -a</code>	<code>dir /AH</code>	List hidden files
<code>Cp</code>	<code>copy</code>	Copy files
<code>Rm</code>	<code>del</code> or <code>erase</code>	Remove files
<code>Cat</code>	<code>type</code>	Type out files
<code>Mv</code>	<code>rename</code>	Move or rename files
<code>rmdir</code>	<code>rd</code>	Remove a directory
<code>chmod</code>	<code>attrib</code>	Change file attributes
<code>clear</code>	<code>cls</code>	Clears the screen
<code>man</code>	<code>help</code>	Help on command

The I/O redirection operators ">" , ">>" and "|" also work on DOS.
